Basic mandate of SESRIC is threefold:

- To **collate, process and disseminate socio-economic statistics and information** on and for the utilisation of the Member States
- To **study and evaluate the economic and social developments** in the Member States to help **generate proposals** that will initiate and enhance cooperation among them
- To **organise training programmes** in selected fields geared to the needs of the Member States as well as to the general objectives of the Organization of the Islamic Cooperation (OIC)

I. Statistics Department



- SESRIC is the major socio-economic information bank on and for OIC Member States
- collecting → processing → disseminating data to all relevant institutions and interested individuals
- Regularly sending questionnaires to NSOs of member states
- BASEIND : main statistical database
 - Data on 253 socio-economic variables under 17 categories for 57 OIC Member States dating back to 1970
 - Possible to make research over country, theme and year
 - Updated regularly, member states can enter their information
 - Free and easy access
- Motion Charts (trends of several indicators over time) and Thematic Maps (comparative situation of the OIC Member States for the given theme with varying colors)
- Publishing **Statistical Yearbook of OIC Countries** and **Basic Facts and Figures on OIC Member Countries**

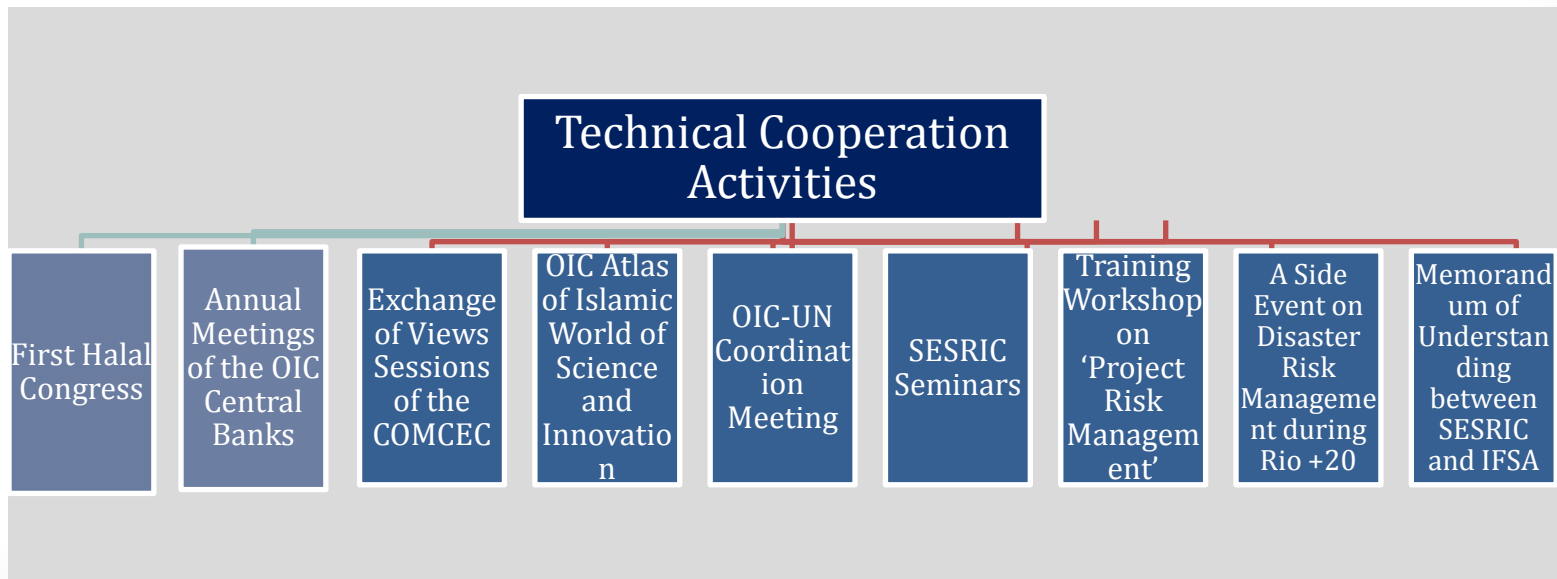
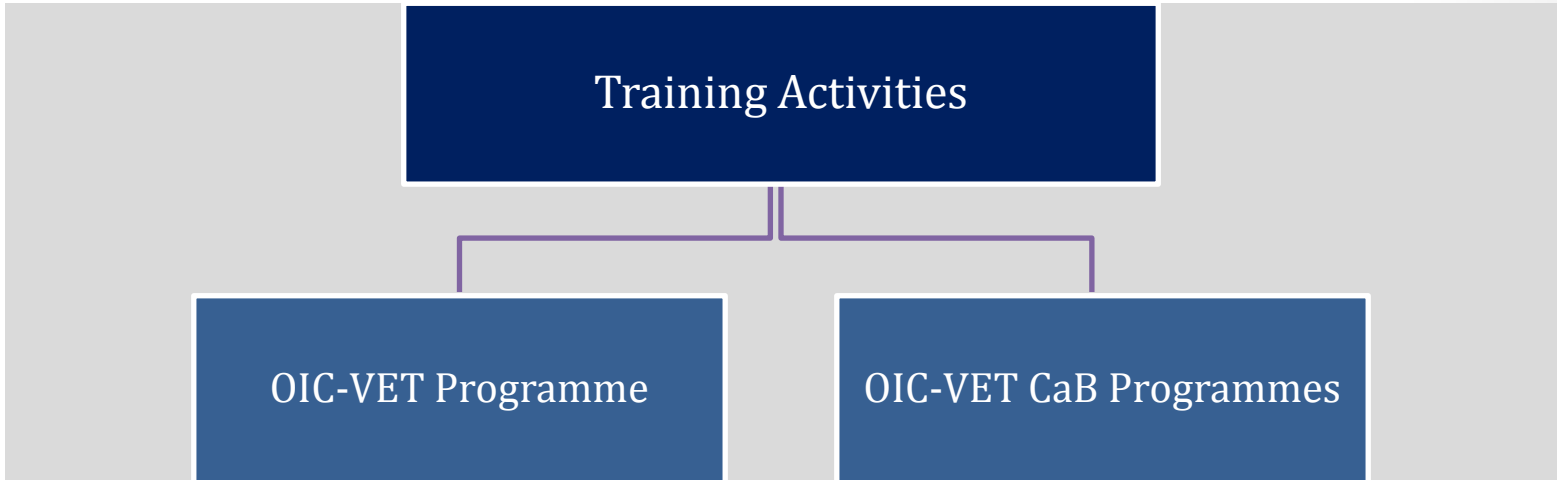


Training and Technical Cooperation Department

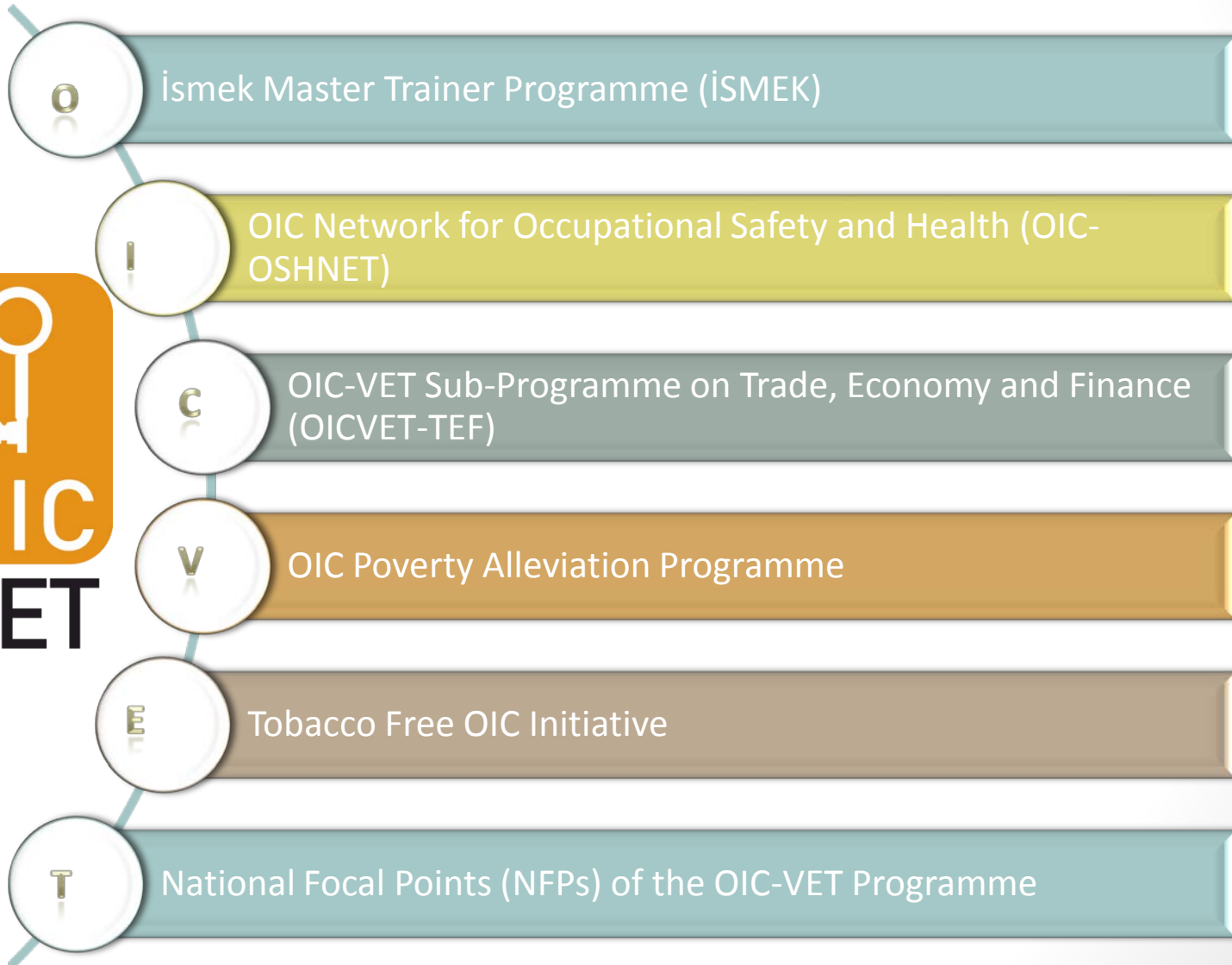


- SESRIC is the focal point for implementing and promoting coordination among relevant institutions in **enhancing training activities** in the OIC Member States
